THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT & FINANCIAL STATEMENT

On behalf of the Committee of S.T.C. Cricket Club, I present the 13th Annual Report and Financial Statement for Season 79/80.

SECRETARY

S.T.C. again fielded three Senior Teams as in previous years in the Matting Section, being "A", "C" and "D" Grades in E.S.C.A. The "A" and "C" sides made the semi-finals, but unfortunately both teams were defeated. The "D" Grade side held bottom position at the end of the season, but they were not disgraced as they had many young cricketers who lacked the experience, which senior cricket demands.

There were many fine performances during the season as the following summaries will show.

1ST <u>XI</u>

Led by Peter Sandilands the Firsts won 8, lost 4 and drew 1. Finishing on top at the end of the home and home games, the side felt confident of doing well in the finals after a long absence from the glory of success - however, it was not to be.

During the season it was quite noticeable that in most innings there was always some sort of collapse in our batting which means there must be a more concentrated effort at training to overcome this problem.

- B. Finnigan never gives in as his figures show: 8/103 (30 overs), 7/34 and 5/48 (When will he come to rest on the shelf?)
- B. Cain 5/31

The same problem occurred this season as in the last and that is the lack of another opening bowler to ease the strain on Alan and Greg. So look around chaps, I'm sure there is someone around (maybe yourself). Also, we acquired an all-rounded batsman this season, namely

John Milinkovic who somehow fitted into the side rather well.

In the semi-final we met Malvern City and as usual Peter Sandilands lost the toss and we were sent in. A disastrous innings being all out for 160 - top scorers were M. Yarwood 37 and B. Finnigan 27. It was our turn to prove ourselves, but wickets were hard to come by and the opposition eventually passed our score making 9/175 when play ended. Greg Wignell took 4/40 from 26 overs and Brian Cain took 2/43 from 19 overs.

It was a disappointing end to a good season - definitely our turn this season.

2ND XI

Led by Bernie Brell the Seconds won 5, lost 4 and drew 4. After a shakey start to the season the side finished Fourth and were determined to prove that they belonged in "B" Grade after demotion last season. Again, a disappointing result in the semi-final.
