1st. ELEVEN REPORT.

The "Ones" came within 98 runs of achieving the ultimate- an "A" Grade Premiership.

The 1982/83 season brought for S.T.C. a mixture of success and disappointment. Consistent performances in the early part of the season, particularly against potential finalists, saw the Firsts high on the ladder immediately prior to Christmas. However, two losses against middle order sides in Kooyong and Mulgrave partially offset our earlier advantage.

With a fine showing of team spirit, we were able to notch up an outright win and two first innings victories in successive matches before our last round defeat by the eventual Premiers.

Our reward was a place in the "A" Grade Four. The first Semi-Final in which we were definitely the under-dogs, saw our finest performance for the season. Spurred on to new heights by an unbelievable atmosphere at Nettleton Park, we had top side South Camberwell all out for 182 - a mediocre score on the fast, bald surface which we knew so well. We replied with 7 for 257, in an innings highlighted by Bryan Cain's 104 and a "never-lose" attitude by all players. I sincerely thank the Social Committee and our seconds and thirds players for their monumental efforts in providing support by way of banners, first-floor accommodation and spirit that the opposition was shell-shocked on their arrival at Nettleton.

Unfortunately, our Grand Final appointment did not meet with the success which, I feel, the players and S.T.C. as a club deserved this season.

Batting first, Box Hill Districts compiled 299 runs from a mammoth 140-1 over. This reflected how well our bowlers stuck to the task. Best figures were returned by Greg Wignell (4-51 from 33 overs), Pat Wignell (3-49 from 21 overs), Bryan Cain (1-54 from 22.1 overs) and Chris Hoare (1,29 from 19 overs).

Our bowlers were well supported by our fieldsmen who were well led by wicket-keeper Kevin Burt who completed 4 catches.

We were then set 300 runs in 348 minutes for victory - sufficient time if we were good enough. Unfortunately, by stumps on the second day we were 4-67, but still confident of Premiership success. The final days play saw S.T.C. withstanding enormous pressure, before finally being dismissed for 201. It was a pity to see the efforts of Eugene Fitzwilliam 54 not out, Bryan Cain 39 and Chris Hoare 27 going in vain.

I believe that the lack of a genuine pace bowler contributed largely to the result, in that we were unable to make vital breakthroughs against Box Hill Districts, whom I congratulate on their Grand Final success.

The season for S.T.C. Firsts was pleasing in that our overall performance can accurately be described as a team effort. One measure of this is that six of our batsmen accumulated 250 runs, the basic requirement for recognition in the E.S.C.A. association averages.

Our success was due in no small way to the assistance given me by my Vice-Captain, Bryan Cain, whose advice and indeed strong performances often inspired the side to victory.

The acquisition of Chris Hoare, the return of Eugene Fitzwilliam and the continued improvement of our younger players, strengthened our side, and, combined with the more consistent performance of our senior players, should stand us in good stead in the immediate future.

I would like to congratulate Greg Wignell on his third Dunstan Medal and his achievement in breaking the Club record for wickets in the First Eleven.

On behalf of all players, I sincerely acknowledge the assistance of our scorer, Ian Constable.

Finally I thank all players for their undying efforts and outstanding support extended me during the past season.

### 2nd. ELEVEN REPORT.

The one day opening fixture loss to Ashwood by 4 runs reinforced our belief that every team should have an official scorer.

We still maintain that we were the victims of a fast pen.

Despite some good individual performances we could not put it together as a team in the early part of the season, and the next five games resulted in losses with rock bottom being reached with an outright defeat by Richmond City in round 6.

Aided by the inclusion of experienced performers in Denis Harrison, Kevin Lynch and Mick McGetrick, and the obvious improvement of the younger brigade, we recorded our first win of the season in round 7 against our old foe- Malvern City (who were at that stage in fourth position).

This started a chain of four wins in the five games, with probably the highlights being our thrashing of Ashwood in the full-day game ( we proved that a scorer can make a difference ), and a test score of 456 against the third top team Canterbury in round 11. ( John Marshall recorded his maiden century for the Club in this game- 100 N.O.)

Our opposition in the latter part of the season were amazed that we were in such a lowly position, and often remarked that, had we been in the finals, we would have been in with a chance BUT, winning those early games is vital, and surely we will learn from the past season.

The spirit of the 29 players who lined up for the "twos" over the season was excellent- even during the early part of the season when we were wondering what you had to do to win a game, and this is clearly a reflection of the leadership of the top office bearers.

On a personal basis, I will take this opportunity of thanking Peter Pawsey for his support as Vice-Captain, Umpire, Scorer, Tea-maker Hard-Hitting Batsman (sometimes), and Part-time Bowler, and the rest of the players for their support. And, I will be monitoring the progress of a quartet of talented young players - John O'Callaghan, Patrick Docherty, John Marshall, and Andrew Murray, who I expect to be 1st. Eleven players in the near future.

### 3rd. ELEVEN REPORT.

Following their relegation from D Grade, the Third Eleven finished the 1982/83 season in fifth position on the E Grade ladder.

This was a most creditable performance with some 25 players contributing to this result in varying proportions. Seven players joined the Club for the first time while two others returned to S.T.C.

Some of the highlights of the season were :-

- gaining outright points over N.E. Jewish in the opening one day match of the season with Graeme Sayers taking 5/17 and 5/8 in his first match with Club.
- Third X1 record of 5/404 against Adult Deaf with the McGetrick Bros. starring, Mick scoring 123 and Chris 101 N.O. Also, among the runs were Gary Wittingslow 83 and Andy Dieth 41 N.O.
- a good team effort against Mulgrave producing 8/303 with top scorers being Ross Harazsti 57 and Tim Allen 55.

Two first season players who deserve special mention are Graeme Sayers who consistently produced good all round performances finishing with 195 runs at an average of 24.38, 23 wickets at an average of 16.74 and 7 catches, and Gary Wittingslow who, in six innings scored 179 runs at an average of 35.80.

Also Tim Allen who made a welcome return to the Club after some years absence scored 203 runs at an average of 22.56 and took 13 catches behind the stumps.

Both John O'Callaghan and Gerard Finnigan moved up from junior ranks during the season and both are certain to have a successful future with the Club if the potential they showed last season is fulfilled.

It was pleasing that excellent team spirit was maintained throughout the season as evidenced by the team winning the final three matches of the season. With the experience of season 1982/83 behind them the Club can expect improved performances from the majority of the players with the aim being a premiership flag in season 1983/84.
