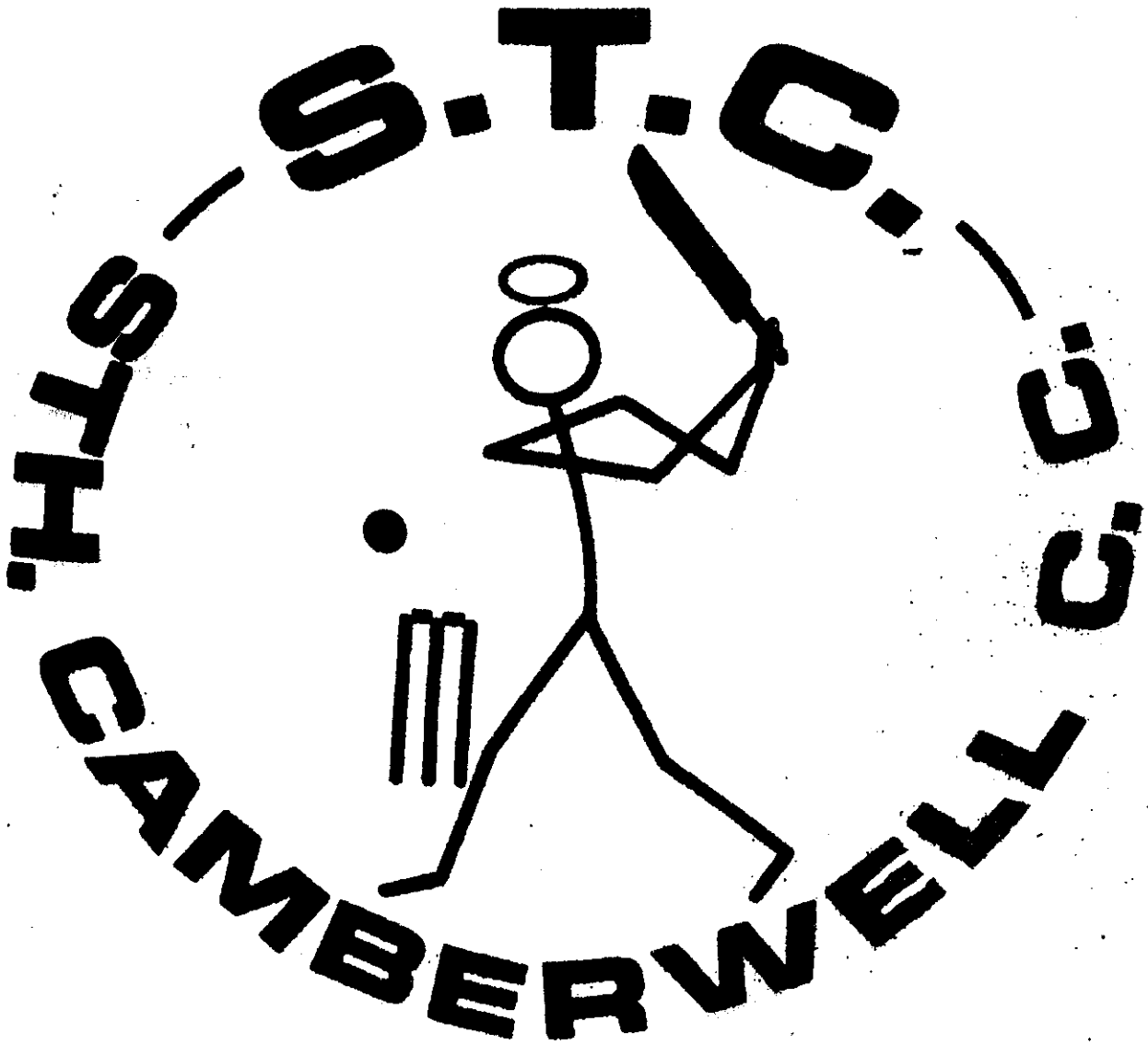

ANNUAL REPORT

1984-85

Members of the STC South Camberwell Cricket Club, Ladies and Gentlemen. It is my pleasure to present to you the 18th Annual Report on the activities of STC South Camberwell Cricket Club.

This season, the club fielded for the second time, four Senior sides in the matting section of the Eastern Suburbs Cricket Association, together with three teams in the Junior Section. 1st XI REPORT

There were a number of outstanding performances during the season. After being thrown into the opening position in Round 4, Bernie Docherty scored 487 runs for the season. Brian McInerney with 310 runs and Chris Hoare running hot after Christmas with 433 runs, were the best efforts with the bat. Consistency marked the bowling attack with our five main bowlers all taking in excess of 20 wickets at similar averages: Bryan Cain 21 wickets at 15.0, Chris Hoare 24 at 18.2, Glen Findlay 26 at 18.5, Mick Mitchell 25 at 19.4 and Pat Wignell 20 at 19.4. We were undoubtedly the best fielding side in "A" Grade, a reputation I hope we will be able to build on in 1985/86.

With only loss during the 'home and away' games, we faced the final series full of confidence. In the semi-final against Mulgrave, an easy win in the finish was obtained due primarily to Pat Wignell's 5/63, Bernie Docherty's 66 and Brian McInerney's 57. The Grand Final against A.Y.C. was ruined by rain on the first two days, and we were never able to get into the game. It was a disappointing finish to the season.

Nonetheless, the 1984/85 season was one all players should be proud of. My thanks to all players for their support, and I look forward to us going one better in '86. I know that we are the best team in "A" grade matting.
