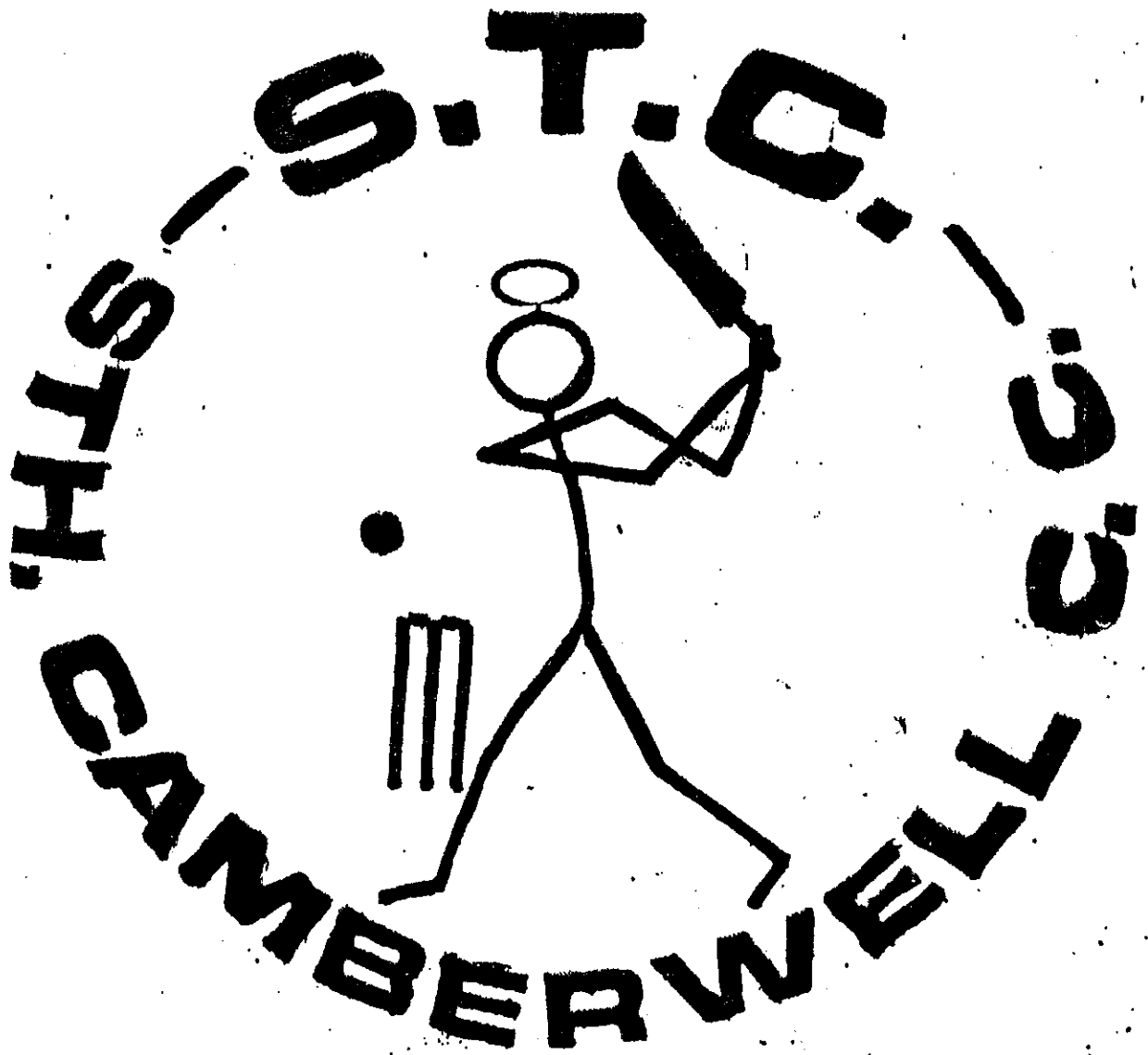

ANNUAL REPORT
1987-88

It is my pleasure to report to you, the members of S.T.C. South Camberwell Cricket Club the 21st Annual Report on the activities of the Club.

We once again fielded four teams in the matting section of the Eastern Suburbs Cricket Association and three teams in the Junior Section. Unlike previous years this time only the first eleven made the finals, however they went on to win that elusive A Grade flag in an outstanding display of determination and team spirit. On many occasions the game seemed lost however the players never gave up and finally won our first A Grade premiership in seventeen years.

The three junior teams once again struggled against bigger and better teams. Congratulations should go to all team managers for the time and effort they put in to keep the teams in the field.

At the start of the season many of our previous 2nd and 3rd eleven players indicated that they would not continue and with the promotion of the 3rd XI to C Grade it was expected that all sides apart from the firsts would struggle. This was certainly the case with the 2nds and 4ths. Andrew Murray the new captain of the 4ths showed great enthusiasm and lead his team of oldies and juniors extremely well.

Kevin Lynch was appointed captain of the 3rd XI for the first time and did a tremendous effort lifting the newly promoted team to within less than game of the four. With the loss of players and promotion of the team this was an outstanding effort.

Bernie Docherty was appointed 1st XI captain. His efforts in welding together a team in every sence of the word are reflected in the premiership win and the joy each team member had in each others success. Full details on this win are included in the first eleven report.

The season was one of many changes. For the first time the club employed a professional coach. A great deal of discussion was held within the club before making the decision and after exhaustive enquiries an approach was made to one of our past players Greg Wignell, who was appointed. The appointment was a learning experience for both Greg and the club but must be considered to have been successfull. It will hopefully lead to bigger and better things in the future.

Unfortunately due to the ground being resurfaced, drainage and sprinklers installed we were unable to play and train on the ground until January. With the pavilion having been completed last year and allowing the grass to consolidate over winter our playing facilities in 1988-89 should be the best in the matting competition.

Once again due to our loyal group of sponsors we were able to meet many of the costs associated with running the club without eating into finances.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

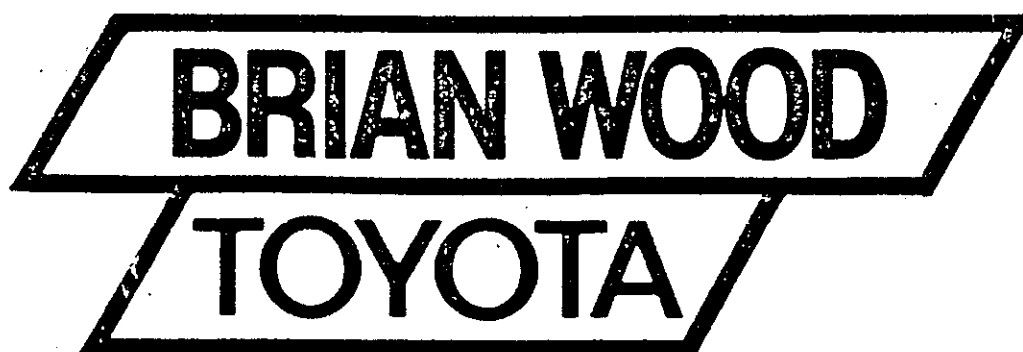
I wish to sincerely thank all committee members, captains and junior team managers for their support throughout the year.

COACHES REPORT

FIRST ELEVEN REPORT

The First Eleven this year enjoyed A Grade success that the Club has'nt seen for seventeen years; we topped off a consistent season with an almighty win in the Grand Final. Finally, after many seasons of being good enough, we became 'A' Grade Premiers.

My sincere thanks go to the Vice-Captain of the side Eugene Fitzwilliam and the coach of the Club Greg Wignell. Eugene's support and advice during the season and Greg's co-ordinating of training and advice to all players was an enormous help on the road to the flag.

Greg also capped off a tremendous season by winning the A.T. Dunstan Medal for the fourth time - well done Greg.

We played twelve home and away games (narrowly losing two) and for the first time for some years finished on top of the ladder. Drawn to play Mulgrave in the semi-final.

It was a cold and windy long weekend and Mulgrave decided to bat. Bowling and fielding in these conditions is never easy, but all the fellows battled well to eventually have Mulgrave all out for 95 at 4.30 pm on the first day. This was a remarkable effort, but the best was yet to come. Opening up with Kevin Burt and Gerard Finnigan we scored the required runs, no wickets down at 2.30pm on the second day. A magnificent effort by those two and all players concerned.

-ON TO THE GRAND FINAL*

We arrived at Auburn Reserve, Victoria Road, expecting to do well against arch rivals South Camberwell. I lost the toss and they decided to bat.

It was a slow and hot first day, finishing with South Camberwell 4/146 at stumps. Patrick Wignell was the best of the bowlers taking 3 wickets, whilst Eugene Fitz and Damien (Snicks) Slattery chipped in with good catches

On the second day the temperature was again up in the 30's and the game evenly balanced. The batting was negatively slow, at tea Sth Camb were 5/223. Luck certainly didn't go our way for the first session, but after tea Kev Burt (in his last appearance with the gloves) got the ball rolling with a beautiful stumping off Greg Wignell then Herman and Pat Wig both took classic diving catches to rip a gapping hole in the Sth Camb batting.

Herman clean bowled Kevin Craig to wipe any good memories he might have had against S.T.C. and Greg hammered the final nail in the coffin with a spectacular caught and bowled.

After having our backs to the wall for a day and a half we capitalized on every opportunity to dismiss Sth Camberwell for 244. ALL WE HAVE TO DO NOW IS BURY THEM.

With 90 minutes to bat we lost opener Gerard Finnigan and night watchman Jack Krohn to be 2/17 at stumps.

The third day again bought temperatures in the 30's and the game was far from won.

Tragedy struck at 1.53pm. We lost 3 wickets for 8 runs, (B. Docherty, G. Wignell & C. Hoare) to make the score 5/61. Kevin fell shortly after tea at 6/71.

This brought Pat Wignell and Mark Duggan to the crease and the recovery began. For three hours they added 44 runs to get us back in the game. Wiggy fell 35 minutes before stumps to introduce Eugene Fitz to the crease.

The fourth and final day saw Duggan arrive with a black eye and Fitzzy return from a wedding in Morwell.

Together these two set about compiling a historic 113 run partnership, forever etching their names into the memories of all at Auburn Reserve. Duggs brought up his 100 before Fitzzy fell for 36 when the score was 228. As is the case with most record partnerships Duggs was out soon after for a game saving 105. Leaving Pat Docherty and Damien Slattery with 15 to score.

The crowd went completely silent. Fifty five minutes into the partnership Pat Doc on drove Barry Watts for four- breathing new found voice into the supporters - as we needed five runs to win.

A no ball and a Snick Slattery off drive sent the ball into the third man boundary and the GRAND FINAL WAS WON. The scoreline reads:

SECOND ELEVEN REPORT

For the first time in several seasons the Seconds failed to make the finals, winning only three and drawing two of the twelve matches for the season. For a variety of reasons it was not possible to establish a settled team, and the regular changes to the XI from game to game certainly contributed to our lack of on field success.

Our bowling particularly was short on experience, and real pace with the new ball, but Justin Hoy, Paul Ledwidge, Mark Molloy and Brendan Hoy, though young, worked hard and Imsure learned much as the season progressed.

The state of Nettleton Park before Christmas severely hampered training, especially fielding, and although there were some brilliant individual efforts for instance Rob Hoich's catch against North Balwyn - our proficiency in the field did not always match our endeavour, which was great.

We were also inconsistent with the bat, collapsing dismally in some games such as the Deepdene, Kerrimuir and Box Hill South fixtures, yet annihilating Ashburton's and Canterbury's attacks. Our main weaknesses lay in our overall inconsistency, our inexperience and our inability to bowl out sides cheaply.

The enthusiasm of the two's, however, did not falter (although our application at practice left some room for improvement) and there is certainly a wealth of talent, and young talent at bat, in the players who represented S.T.C. in B Grade in 1987-88. It is important, if we are to build on this season's A Grade success in the long term, that we continue to maintain a competitive Second XI in B Grade, and I hope that all our Seconds will return, continue to improve and strive for a place in the Firsts in 1988-89.


