PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is my pleasure to report to you, the members of S.T.C. South Camberwell Cricket Club the 22nd. Annual Report on the past seasons activities.

We once again fielded four teams in the matting section of the Eastern Suburbs Cricket Association and only two junior teams - U'16 & U'12. For the first time in ten years none of the sides made the finals and our season finished in late February - far too early an end to the season and hopefully a situation that will be rectified in the forthcoming season.

Unlike the previous season, we did not have a professional coach for the seniors however, we did have a professional coach for our juniors. Basil Finnigan was appointed and his popularity and success was shown by the growing number of boys attending training - approximately 30 U'12's by the end of the season.

Our first 3 senior teams were again in "A", "B" & "C" grades with the 4th. XI in "E" grade matting. Bernie Docherty, Kevin Lynch and Andrew Murray captained the 1st, 3rd & 4th XI's respectively and after some initial problems Rob Molloy was appointed captain of the 2nd XI.

We struggled each match to field full teams but thanks to our hard working chairman of selectors Tim Allen and the captains, we always met our obligations.

All teams were unsettled during the year with frequent changes. Over 80 players participated with the club during the year and this was a major reason which attributed to our non-success this season.

For the first time in three seasons we had both our ground and pavilion available for the complete season. The playing surface is gradually consolidating and the grass covering improving.

We are still learning how to use our pavilion to its best advantage and the provision this year of higher quality food and a B.B.Q. at the end of every match was a further improvement. Special thanks to Tim Allen for looking after the B.B.Q. The matter of cleaning of the rooms is still a problem to be resolved.

Once again, due to our loyal group of sponsors we were able to meet many of the costs associated with operating the club without eating into finances or increasing members subscriptions.

A special word of thanks needs to be expressed to all the members of the committee for the work done over the past year. In particular to Vice President Bernie Docherty, Secretary Eugene Fitzwilliam and Treasurer Michael Kennedy.


1. Basis of Accounting
