## secretary's report

In 2001/2002 the Saints sure went marching in! A year of unprecedented success on the field was coupled with a very strong year in the club's administration.

Despite a number of changes in Committee personnel and five new Captains, the club was again this year able to build on the foundations laid by previous committees. Recycled President Gary Chard ably stepped into the shoes of outgoing President Richard Corbett, and led a group of very dedicated committee men.

In a year so full of action on the field, the committee was able to score some significant runs off the park. ## junior co-ordinator's report

As in recent seasons, STC once again fielded four teams in the ECA's junior competition: two U12s, one U14s and one U16s. All teams were competitive, and the boys enjoyed their cricket and improved their skills through the season under the guidance of the respective managers and coaches.

For the second year, STC conducted a Milo Have A Go Clinic program under the auspices of the Victorian Cricket Association. While the enrolment was small, all participants were enthusiastic, and especially enjoyed their opportunity to appear on the MCG during the innings break of the First One Day International Final between New Zealand and South Africa. Already five Milo participants have represented STC at U12 level.

The U12 Blues comprised mostly boys playing their first season of competitive cricket, with a leavening of experienced players, under the management of Steve Ross. The side had its share of successes, and developed a strong team spirit as the season progresses. Bevin Karunaratne's hat-trick at Lynden Park was one of the shining highlights.

Most of the more experienced U12s played in the Reds, with Mark Parker providing excellent guidance as Manager. The team suffered several narrow defeats in matches which, with a little luck, could have gone our way and significantly affected our final ladder position. Many of the boys have another season of U12 cricket ahead of them and should be looking forward to a big 2002-03.

STC's banner was carried into a junior semi-final for the first time in several years by the U14s, managed by Steve Williams. Having been clobbered by the top side in the last home and away game, STC finished fourth and had to face the same opponent, on its own home ground, in the semi-final. On a hot Sunday STC batted purposefully to set a challenging target of 184, then bowled the top team out for the same score. The tied result meant that STC was eliminated by the narrowest of possible margins, but the team showed great ability, determination and sportsmanship under pressure.

Graeme Johnston's third season as a team manager for STC was spent with the U16s, captained by his son Chris. Slightly down on numbers and robbed of a couple of almost certain wins by inclement weather, the team had a disappointing season in terms of results, but several players showed promise for the future, either in next year's U16s or in senior cricket. Michael Byrne closed out his junior career with an outstanding innings of 96 not out, and was recognised at Junior Presentation Night as the latest STC Junior Legend for his many years of playing service.

Aside from regular training and matches, a number of specific events occurred during the season. Tristan Parker (U12 Reds) was selected to represent ECA in a match against Heidelberg, and performed very well. The VCA again provided complimentary tickets to a One Day Domestic match at the MCG (a thriller between Victoria and NSW), which was enjoyed by all those able to attend. The parents and sons match in February was great fun for all those who took part – thanks to those seniors including Peter Lynch and Peter Morrison who helped out on the day. I would also like to acknowledge Hawthorn-Monash University



Premier League Cricket Club, who provided two senior players for an excellent junior clinic on the Sunday morning immediately before the Christmas Party.

Thanks are due to many people for their efforts this season. Our four team managers again gave sterling service, as did junior coaches Basil Finnigan (U12s and U14s) and Paul Fiscaro (U16s). Basil's dedication in travelling three or four times a week from his home in Mt Martha continues to set a yardstick for club spirit that we can honour, respect and aspire towards. Peter Lynch and Anthony Purcell were excellent deputy coaches, and all senior players who turned up and helped out on their one or two rostered occasions during the season are also thanked. Several, including Chris Classon, Steve Hoy and Sammy Giblett, made a number of additional voluntary contributions as well. In particular, I would like to acknowledge the players who came along and cheered the U14s on in their semi-final.

I would also like to thank the many parents who helped out with scoring, umpiring, canteen duties and transport during the season. It means a lot to the boys to have parental support on the sidelines, and I am sure this was a big factor in the U14s outstanding semi-final performance.

I would like especially to thank Maureen Colman for donating a new perpetual trophy for an U12 player, in memory of her late husband George, a strong supporter of junior sport and at one time a junior team manager at STC. We were most pleased to be able to award the inaugural George Colman Memorial Trophy to an outstanding young man, Karl Linden.

Personally, I would like to thank Peter Lynch, who filled in for me during the five weeks when I was away on holidays immediately pre-season and on other occasions during the season. Peter did an excellent job and without his efforts the season would have got away to a much more uncertain start. I am also grateful to former Junior Co-ordinator Tim Bach for good advice and support whenever I asked for guidance. Finally, I would like to thank my wife Cathy and my sons Phillip and Andrew for their patience with the time I spent at Nettleton and elsewhere on junior business throughout the season.

## second XI report

## third XI report

I was privileged enough to be captain of the 3<sup>rd</sup> XI this year for the first time. I was 'lucky' enough to have the support of several past captains in the side at various times, including Paul Zennaro, Gary Chard, Jack Krohn, Stuart McCulloch, Rick Corbett and Pat Docherty, always willing to help out with a bit of advice

The season started impressively as we went undefeated until Rd.8. The early games were highlighted by the team's consistency; with someone always stepping up when required to make a difference. Solid opening stands from Zed and Shack, and good contributions from Jack, Chainy, Ali D, Lee Fiz, Pat Doc, Adam Burt, Larn, DOC III and Tom Bach in a revolving middle order continuously gave us competitive totals and confidence in the batting line up. Great consistency by Smitty and Ali in the bowling department was backed up by some terrific performances from Dales, Benny Mannix, Dave Grace and Mickey P. A great pre-Christmas one-day win over Boorondara, led by Zed (53), DOC (86) and Jack (43) in one of the great run chases, saw us sitting 7-1 with a washout.

After Christmas, we hoped to find a settled side with a finals spot already sewn up. Having already lost Ali D to the seconds, some good performances by Luke, DOC and Hodgy meant we lost more players to the 2nds. The inclusion and good form of Micky P, Dave Hegan, Dave Grace and Lynchy more than compensated for this.
